What does the BIBs Pantry provide?

Upon request BIBs Pantry provides expectant mothers with nourishing food, fresh food/meat vouchers and hygiene kits. The mothers come to the pantry by referral from HealthNet Community Health Centers Healthy Families program.

The mothers may also receive, upon request by referral, layette items for their newborn babies. This includes clothes in preemie, newborn or 0-3 month sizes, diapers and wipes, blankets, bottle kits and bath items.

For babies up to 24 months of age, clothing in size 3 month to 24 month, and diapers size 1 to 6 are also available.

All clients are from the Indianapolis – Marion County area.

How Many are Served By BIBs Pantry?

The number of referrals BIBs filled rose from 60 during the latter part of 1991 to a peak of 868 in 2006, when the pantry served families of children up to 4 years of age. In 2023, BIBs Pantry filled 450 referral for 197 families, impacting nearly 880 family members. BIBs has filled more than 15,000 referrals throughout the past 32 years.
