

FROM THE HEIGHTS



The Chapel at the Mountainside

Exploring along the valley of the Teton mountains, we came across a small Episcopal chapel with stunning views of the mountain peaks to its west.

While our stomachs were grumbling for dinner, this serene spot insisted we rest and meditate for a moment. The mist upon the mountain spires evoked God's presence like a pillar of cloud before the congregation, and the wooden pews beacons us to dwell beneath God's splendor and give thanks. What a breathtaking space to have church.

The chapel's original architect did not build on the spot to mark a particular holy encounter or spiritual epiphany. The church was built because ranchers couldn't get anywhere else. For the folks out in the country, taking the long arduous bumpy wagon ride to Jackson, WY was impractical. They would have to navigate the challenging Snake River by ferry to get to Sunday services. When Menor's Ferry broke and worshippers had to travel even further down river, the ranchers had experienced enough. The newly constructed Transfiguration Chapel opened its door in 1925 and has been actively holding summer services ever since. (No services in the winter as even modern-day travelers can't make it to church where several feet of snow go unplowed.) I'm sure that as a preacher or two droned on, the mountain backdrop provided



a mesmerizing escape. _But the motive for this church spot was convenience.



When you remember the event from which the chapel gets its name, you find Peter, James, and John also having a worship

service on the mountain. _They journeyed together on the seventh day up Mt. Tabor to witness Jesus's clothes turning a dazzling white while historic prophets of the faith appeared in his company. It was an experience of spiritual splendor; the men didn't want to leave. _They suggested building a little church on the summit because it was convenient to have Jesus, Moses, and Elijah all together. _They could avoid the strains of the world and praise God with hearts full from the holy high. _Jesus, of course, tells the men to prepare to return to ministry in the valley.

We come to church to be awakened by the beauty of God. _We long to stand before the majesty of God and offer our gratitude. Sometimes we also make our way to church (or we skip) based on convenience. _Do we come to the sanctuary hoping it will make life a little easier? _Do we neglect gathering with the faithful when it doesn't fit our schedule, our weather forecast, or the distance we want to travel that day? _When life gets bumpy and stressful, is worship something we decide to miss? _For all the reasons we gather, Jesus reminds us that the holy encounter on the mountain was an assuring event of God's might that equipped his followers for the real work of ministry with the people down the hillside. _Having seen God's majesty, they were charged with asking, "What are we going to do about pain, suffering, and ugliness in the world?"

The pews will always be open and available for all who want to come, kneel, pray, and rest in the presence of God. _But don't be surprised when the Spirit says it's time to go.




